

# Notice of Proposals

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

## Lower Maudlin Street – Proposed Zebra Crossing

Notice is hereby given that **Example Council** proposes to make a permanent Traffic Regulation Order under sections 1, 23 and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

### Details of the proposal

The proposed Order would provide for the installation of a **zebra pedestrian crossing on Lower Maudlin Street**, near the junction with College Lane, as shown on the accompanying plan.

The works would include the provision of:

- A marked zebra crossing
- Belisha beacons and associated signage
- Road markings and minor alterations to the highway layout

### Purpose of the proposal

The proposed zebra crossing is intended to:

- Improve pedestrian safety on a busy pedestrian route
- Assist people crossing to and from nearby educational, retail and community facilities
- Reduce the risk of collisions by providing a clearly designated crossing point
